Our well-trained and committed staff invested intentionally week after week into the lives of campers. Not only were campers impacted, but our summer staff grew in their faith and commitment to follow Christ, too!

- 6 campers received Christ!
- 5 received assurance of salvation!
- 22 others made decisions for obedience to Christ in some area of their lives.

In early August, **Summit Trails Unlimited (STU)**, our backpacking division of *Bible Camping Inc.*, hosted both a ladies' "day-hikes" trip based at Red Cliff, and a progressive backpacking trip from Spring Creek Park to Green River Lakes. With some rain (but not enough to dampen the fun and fellowship we experienced together) we studied God's Word, hiked, fished, camped, and battled rogue porcupines! (See page 6 for photos.)

In response to our need to finish every part of the Lodge, God has once again supplied in a tremendous way! **Red Cliff received a gift of \$124,000** for specific areas of the building that will be addressed this fall and winter. Praise God with us for this gift, and pray that labor and supply will be available for the work.

Staff recruiting for the summer of 2025 has already begun. Please pray with us that God will send us just the right staff members for each position. He alone can build a Christ-centered team. Pray as well that God will grant safety in travel to the colleges in September and October.

# **Lodge Work This Summer**

Many projects were accomplished on the Lodge during our summer season which began with a group of workers the first week of **June:** Painting, sewing, trimming windows, doors and countertops, clear-coating wood trim and spiral staircase steps, adhering baseboard, installing attic ladder, tiling bathrooms, hanging exterior siding, cleaning, and setting up!



Exterior siding work continued into **July**, and we are excited to let you know that a work group came this fall to put the siding on the gable ends of the Lodge. Railings for the fire stairs were fabricated during the last week of **July**. The exterior rock masonry continued **July** through **August** and is 99% completed on the frontside! The yearly tree gathering for firewood occurred in **mid-September** with two volunteers from Idaho!

During **August and September** hand rails were added on the west side of the Lodge, and the hand railing on the spiral staircase was completed! Extensive work on the camp road happened in **June** and **July**. Donated use of a bulldozer, mini track-hoe, water truck, dump truck, and six weeks of donated time from a volunteer improved the road immensely for cars and vans to travel into Camp!

Ladies' Retreat was a blessing! (Yes, each week of the summer and fall has been a great blessing - this is just the most recent retreat of the season.) We enjoyed meeting new campers, getting to catch up with those who were able to return from past years, fellowshipping with each other, hearing the Word shared, attending workshop sessions, watching many ladies encouraging others who might be facing challenges personally, and being encouraged ourselves! Memories from the past... Dick remembers that the first culverts made for roadway use were made of wood covered with tar paper. The road was rough. The "old-timers" will remember praying for good weather so the road would at least be dry enough to travel. The Lord was good as there was only 1 Family Camp that had to be cancelled due to weather. A blessing! The tent frames later turned into cabins, then the Lord blessed with carpentry guys from college coming out to help and receive training in woodworking skills at the same time. (Dave Heyboer was one of those first students.) Those cabins are the duplex cabins we now use all the time. To get wood for building the cabins, we obtained tree permits from the USFS, and purchased a Wood Miser sawmill. (There are 200+ logs in each cabin.) Jack Hegardt, (one of our original Board members and a professional stone mason) laid the foundation for each cabin. The volunteers who helped with each part of the building process are too many to count but genuine blessings, each one.

We learned that the "spring of water" was on our neighbor's property, so a well was needed for our own use. The well digger had been working near the end of the paved road, and was willing to come up to dig for water at the Camp. Even though the elevation at Camp is higher, the total cost of digging was less, and the well did not have to be as deep to get good water. Another blessing indeed!

**Dick is continuing physical therapy.** We learned that a major part of his muscle loss is due to the cancer medication

he is taking. We are thankful for the blessing of therapists who know how to help in reversing that loss. In all this, **God is GOOD**, and we thank Him for His continued blessings.




